Speech by Ambassador at the Signing Ceremony of the Lake Urmia Restoration Project

It is a great honor for me to attend this occasion and say a few words on behalf of the Government of Japan.

First of all, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to those who have kindly organized this Signing Ceremony of the Lake Urmia Restoration Project.

To our regret and as is widely known to the public, the situation of the Lake Urmia is still critical today.

In response to the critical situation of the Lake, the Government of Japan decided back in February to donate 1 million U.S. Dollars to the UNDP's project for the restoration of the Lake Urmia via local community participation in sustainable agricultural practices and biodiversity conservation.

I would like to briefly mention that Japan has been continuously supporting the restoration of the Lake since 2014, and in fact, this is the fifth time Japan has contributed to the endeavors to revive Lake Urmia, a total of about 5 million U.S. Dollars thus far, following the Summit Meetings between Prime Minister Abe and President Rouhani in 2013.

As a result, sustainable agriculture techniques have been established and implemented in 110 villages. The project to be implemented this year aims at up-scaling the project sites to 20 new villages.

Japan strongly hopes that this project further contributes to the restoration of the beautiful Lake as well as the welfare and betterment of the lives of the local people.

It should be noted that the Government of Japan also made another financial contribution to FAO in August 2016, for its project on "Integrated Program for Sustainable Water Resources Management in the Urmia Lake Basin".

I strongly hope that these projects generate maximum synergy.

Lastly, I would like to once again express my sincere gratitude to all those who are actively engaged and devoted to this truly challenging endeavor.
